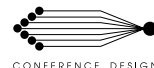

Invited Speakers

Professor Bob Montgomery FAPS

Professor Bob Montgomery is a Fellow of the Australian Psychological Society and a Member of the Society's Colleges of Clinical Psychologists, Forensic Psychologists, and Health Psychologists.

Over more than 30 years he has combined the twin streams of professional practice and research plus teaching at Sydney, Macquarie, La Trobe, Hawaii, Oregon and Bond Universities. He left his position as Foundation Professor of Psychology at Bond University in December 2001 to return to private practice.

In February 2003 he took up an appointment as Professor and Head of Psychology at the University of Canberra, with the main goal of developing its professional training program in clinical, health, forensic, sport and military psychology.

Professor Montgomery currently has a full-time private practice on the Gold Coast and is an Adjunct Professor in Psychology at the University of the Sunshine Coast, where he contributed to the establishment of their new psychology program.

He has over 30 publications in scientific and professional journals and is the author of thirteen best-selling self-help books, now published in a number of countries. He is well known to the public through his presentations on psychology on the radio, particularly the ABC, and through television and the print media. He is married to Dr Laurel Morris; their recreations include bush-walking, surfing, alpine skiing, and scuba diving.

Dr Debra Rickwood

Dr Rickwood is Professor of Psychology at the Centre for Applied Psychology, University of Canberra. She is a community psychologist who researches in the areas of young people's help-seeking behaviour; factors affecting mental health and wellbeing, including alcohol and other drug use; promotion, prevention and early intervention for mental health; recovery from mental illness; and health service evaluation.

Stephen Leeder is a Professor of Public Health and Community Medicine at the University of Sydney and Director of the Menzies Centre for Health Policy. He has worked for over 35 years in epidemiological research, medical education reform, public health research and health policy. In 2003-04, Professor Leeder worked at Columbia University's Earth Institute and Mailman School of Public Health, where he developed a substantial report on the economic consequences of cardiovascular disease (CVD) in developing economies.

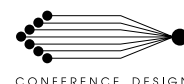
